Eugene Lynch

When you look with your eyes Everything seems nice But if you look twice You can see it's all lies

- Lily Allen

This profound statement from Lily Allen's masterpiece LDN serves as the epigraph to *The Pigeons*. It has inspired us to create a world that appears "nice" at first glance but, upon closer inspection, reveals that it is "all lies."

David Gieselmann is a Gen X playwright from Germany. Unique in the German theatre landscape, he is one of the few writers specialising in comedy in his *Heimat*. Early in his career, he worked at the Schaubühne in Berlin and the Royal Court in London, where he was mentored by Sarah Kane. His major influences include Alan Ayckbourn, Michael Frayn, and Yasmina Reza. Between Sarah and Alan, that is a... diverse confluence of taste and style, where light comedy meets formally challenging theatrical ideas.

Along with being Anglophilic, David is also a die-hard pop music fan. He has run one of Europe's oldest pop music blogs, writing about the genre since 2003! To honour our author's passion for pop, we have set the piece in the year of its creation, 2009, opening up a wealth of musical inspiration. This was the year that brought us mega-hits from Lily Allen and Lady Gaga.

In staging *The Pigeons*, I have had the privilege of working with an incredible creative team and cast, whose rigour and ambition have brought our vision to life. We have worked to find a physical response to this formally challenging verbal farce, resulting in a highly physical production. It has been a joy to create what you are seeing here tonight!



Some of them include a Flyman on *Wicked* and Mech on *West Side Story* (HOSH), and some of Sydney's smaller venues including Set Builder on *Hello Girls* at the Hayes and Set Builder for *The Hero Leaves One Tooth* here at KXT. This makes him ready for any challenge and always ready to learn new techniques and skills.
